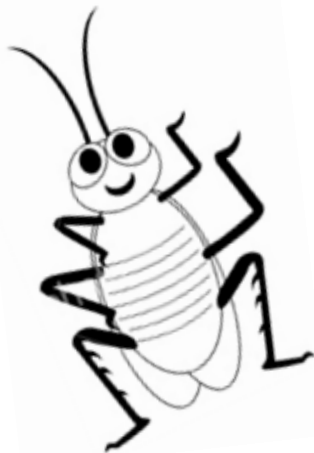

The first fall program was a great experience for Literacy Partners. We were able to partner with the Luxemburg-Casco PTA group for a presentation. Cindy Kinnard, RN, presented a first aid program to 36 members of the LC PTA. It was focused on first aid in the home, and was thorough, interesting, and very pertinent information to all families in our community. The hour long presentation flew by with questions, lots of interesting facts/information, and even a few laughs! Participants were given a dry erase marker board (with Literacy Partners logo and contact information on it) to write down emergency information for their family. Participants also got to keep a colorful, user friendly first aid pamphlet that Cindy created. The marker boards are magnetic and meant to stay on the refrigerator. Over half of the participants also received a fabulous first aid kit (we had a drawing). It was a successful night. We hope to partner again with them, as well as other county organizations/groups in the future!



On November 5, Literacy Partners had Cindy Kinnard, RN, present the same first aid program to our students and tutors. The event was held at the LC Middle School, and was again a huge success. This information will help our students be better prepared in the event of a minor injury, as well as know when additional medical assistance is needed. All participants left with a marker board and a first aid kit (in addition to the colorful, user friendly pamphlet that Cindy created). Children of the families who could not find childcare were entertained in a separate room by two high school girls (Cindy's daughter and friend). They did a wonderful job keeping the children occupied so their parents could enjoy and learn from the presentation. A special thanks to Danielle Metzger, who interpreted the entire program!
